Some might have filed more recent accounts. In most cases charities supply only the numbers and the £10k salary band of employees paid more than £60k. The salary of the highest-paid employee might include benefits such as bonuses, travel and accommodation costs. There might be some senior staff in charities with smaller incomes than the top 150 who are paid more than those in the table.
